

Message from the President

Everyone at Help 4 HD International is working hard every day to educate the world about Huntington's disease. As a company, we are identifying unmet needs within the community and building programs to help fill some of the gaps. We hold tight to our grassroots and use our experiences living in families impacted by Huntington's disease to develop and implement programs we believe will truly assist our community in navigating their very difficult journey living with Huntington's disease.

Help 4 HD International hosts the very first radio show created for the Huntington's disease community. We will continue bringing important, credible information to the Huntington's and Juvenile Huntington's disease communities in the comfort of their own homes. We wrapped up 2023 having aired our 596th episode. We are thankful to have Lauren Holder on our team, providing our community with valuable information, resources, and education through this program. We remain the first ever, longest running, and only weekly podcast focused on the Huntington's disease community.

Another weekly Help 4 HD International program is Help 4 HD TV. We closed this year having aired 239 episodes covering a wide range of topics including HD resources, caregiver burnout, benefits and insurance, cognitive issues in HD, talking about HD with children and the public, advocacy, safe eating, dating, awareness campaigns, research updates, loneliness, living with chorea, psychiatric symptom management, crisis intervention, feeding tubes, and message banking.

This year, Help 4 HD International attended and exhibited at three law enforcement meetings in North Carolina, California, and Michigan. In North Carolina we exhibited at the Chief of Police Annual Conference and Expo. In Michigan we not only exhibited but were also selected to teach a session at the Crisis Intervention Teams International Annual Conference, meeting 1,100 first responders, co-responders and crisis intervention team members from across the nation. We continue visiting local law enforcement mental health agencies and advanced officer training courses to aid officers and first responders in better understanding Huntington's disease. We persist in distributing our Huntington's Disease Law Enforcement Education materials nationally. We also continue offering window decals labeled "Someone with Huntington's Disease is Onboard" and HD ID cards at no cost, which hundreds utilize annually.

In 2023, Help 4 HD International assisted many Huntington's and Juvenile Huntington's disease families in need through our Family Relief Fund, which we firmly believe provides vital support. We understand Huntington's disease brings financial devastation to many impacted families. Our relief fund has helped supply food, clothes, quality of life essentials, utility payment assistance, gas cards, travel expenses to appointments and more. We also provided meal cards for holiday meals and operated a toy drive for children living in homes impacted by HD.

In 2023, we ran our HIPE (Highly Interactive Participant Education) program. Help 4 HD conceived this interactive program in response to needs within the HD community. Collectively caregivers, patients and medical professionals discussed real life scenarios and suggested strategies for dealing with issues families face. We sorely missed convening in person during the pandemic. This year we assembled in Detroit and Puerto Rico, while recognizing the ongoing value of virtual access through two online HIPE days. We also shipped hundreds of HD Swag boxes containing wearables, awareness bracelets, first aid kits and HD information and resources. Registration for these complimentary virtual events and swag boxes typically fills within days.

We capped off 2023 hosting our annual symposium in San Diego with speakers from across the nation providing research updates and guidance on navigating HD journeys. While the talks proved worthwhile, the true magic occurred during both evening social gatherings. We came together, sharing laughter, tears and dance as a community there for one another.

We look forward to growing partnerships with other organizations. This year we teamed with HD Genetics to fund testing costs for families and with the Hereditary Disease Foundation to feature young scientists on Help 4 HD Live! who are unlocking HD mysteries to pave the way for future treatments and a cure.

We continue operating our weekly caregiver support group and bimonthly JHD group, with plans to introduce additional virtual support in 2024.

Our most exciting 2023 launch was the Help 4 HD Resource Database, harnessing AI with human vetting to consolidate helpful resources in one place. We also hired a social worker to assist community members.

We strive at Help 4 HD International to prevent future generations from suffering Huntington's disease as we and previous generations have. Our dream is to transform unawareness into awareness and lack of compassion into empathy. We work through education to make this dream a reality. We remain in the trenches alongside our community, wholly committed to supporting those impacted by Huntington's disease and educating the world about the many challenges they face.

- My baby is in need of diapers and I do need essentials as of right now so thank you so much.
- I have an eviction notice pending and this is going to help me tremendously. You have no idea how grateful I am right now.
- I was fired due to missing days and weeks of work because of my depression from HD and I am struggling to pay my rent because disability is taking a while.
- I was unfortunately diagnosed with HD a year and half ago. I am the youngest of 4 siblings. And I have a 5 year old son. I'm unable to work to help my girlfriend pay the bills and with the cost of everything going higher it's hard to just get by sometimes.
- You have no idea how incredibly thankful I am to you for all your help and time and everyone else to make this possible. I've been in panic mode each day closer to Christmas now its like a weight was just lifted on my shoulders. Honestly words can't describe how much I appreciate it all!

This year, Help 4 HD International spent \$55,166 to help people with genetic testing, food, clothes, energy, medical expenses, quality of life/hygiene essentials, and more. HD Resource Databse

The HD Resource Database is an interactive database where families impacted by HD look for resources like adaptive equipment, anti-discrimination information, caregiver support resources, eating safely, estate planning, family planning, end-of-life planning, financial planning, grief and bereavement, home health information, respite, placement, waivers, legal aid, nutrition, support services, mental health services, self-care, animal services, transportation services, and more. Families can also reach out to us through our Contact Us form if they have any questions or need assistance requesting services. Our social worker is working with these families case by case. We have already started accepting requests. So far, we have received requests for assistance for things like electricity, respite, and another request for support services to help them with the day-to-day struggles they are trying to navigate. We also receive requests for information like law enforcement training and support group information.

Help 4 HD Support Groups

Help 4 HD International hosts a weekly virtual support group for HD caregivers every Tuesday. We also host a JHD Caregiver support group on the first and third Tuesday of every month. We have watched these support groups grow over the last three years. We will be adding new support groups in 2024. We have heard the community call these virtual support groups their lifelines. They have found their tribe within the group. The support, love, community, and knowledge shared within these support groups every week is truly unique. Together, we are stronger, and support groups are the way not to feel so isolated and alone.









What have you had to reduce due to a lack of HD awareness? Community Responses:

~My daughter was nearly strip-searched at the airport when she was probably because her hip moved a little when she was going through the body scanner. She was maybe 70 lbs and wearing a t-shirt and leggings...she couldn't have been hiding something on her body if she wanted to. We explained that she had HD and they wouldn't give us the time of day.

~My daughter's father was kicked out of an establishment because they thought he was extremely drunk, but it was just Huntington's. Even after trying to explain, they wouldn't let him back in.

~ My husband was pushing a shopping cart in Walmart with our little girl, who was about nine months old at the time. These women started whispering loudly so we could hear, saying they couldn't believe I let that guy who was "obviously very drunk" push my daughter in a cart, and hopefully, I didn't let him drive too.... Their children were running up and down the aisles like heathens. My husband didn't want me to, but I turned around and said, at least my kid is well-behaved, and I know where she is ... oh and also, my husband is sick with a terminal neurodegenerative disease called HD and not drunk at all. They were dumb founded.

~My husband also was forced to take a breathalyzer the day before his diagnosis was received, we were driving home from our last hurrah dinner in case the results were bad and had a taillight out. The cop pulled my husband over, told us about the taillight, asked if he had been drinking (he hadn't), and then made him take a breathalyzer unfortunately, that officer ruined our last hours of the before-diagnosis period.

HD Awareness Month

This year, Help 4 HD sent hundreds of HD Awareness boxes nationwide. These boxes had awareness items in them, like pop sockets, straws, awareness cards, window clings, and blanket/pillow combos. The community took pictures holding the awareness cards, answered the questions, and posted them all over social media, creating an amazing HD awareness campaign.




